Topic: Discursive activities by members of the Swiss Parliament during plenary debates about health insurance.

Keywords: redundant public problem – culture of public problems – public sphere – civil society and state – health insurance – parliamentary publicity – ethnomethodology – enunciative analysis

Most important findings :

- There are discursive institutions in the accomplishment of parliamentary publicity about health insurance
- The accomplishment of these discursive institutions is shaped by collective (not party-related) challenges about what MP think that is going to happen next and shape the next-turn discursive activities
- Practical in-situ reasoning of MP explain their discourses during plenary debates, and not belonging to a party or working to the benefit of any interest group
- In the case of health insurance policy, these discursive institutions and their accomplishment according to a practical in-situ reasoning significantly limit possibilities of reform and reduce the efficiency of democratic institutions
- This suggests new directions in theorizing democracy in western european societies
